

**CITY of SHEFFIELD. BYELAWS. Made by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Sheffield, acting by the council with respect to, MARKETS. JOHN HEYS, Town Clerk.**

Interpretation of Terms.

1. Throughout these byelaws - " The council " means the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Sheffield, acting by the Council;

" market hours " means the hours appointed by byelaws 3 for the holding of a market;

" market Place " includes any market - hall market, and place for holding a market within the City of Sheffield belonging to or under the control of the council;

" Goods " includes provisions, commodities, and articals brought into the market for the purpose of sale,

" Stall " includes building, shop, office, compartments, cellar, vault, standing, bench, table, place or space in and having direct access to any market place;

" Sell" and " sale " include exposing and exposure for sale;

" Superintendent " means the General Superintendent for the time being of the council and his lawfully appointed Deputy;

" Market Officer " means any person oppointed by the Council to superintend any market place or to keep order therein;

" Christmas Season " means the seven days immidiately preceding Christmas Day.

Appropriation of Markets.

2. Where the council - (a) appropriate any part of any market place for the sale of animals or articals, or any class of animals or articals, or for sale by auction:  
and-

(b) display in a conspicuous place public notice to that effect to that effect, no person shall sell animals articals, or hold sales by auction, except of that appropriation.

3. Markets shall be held in the market places throughout each market on the days and during the hours specified hereunder -

CASTLE MARKET.

Monday to Wednesday ... ..8.00 am to 5.00 pm

Thursday ... .. 8.00 am to 1.00 pm

Friday ... .. 8.00 am to 6.00 pm

Saturday ... .. 8.00 am to 5.30 pm

SHEAF MARKET (except Wholesale produce section )

Monday to Wednesday ... .. 8.00 am to 5.00 pm

Thursday ... .. 8.00am to 5.30 pm

Saturday ... .. 8,00am to 6.00 pm

Closing times during the Christmas Season shall be 6.00 pm on all days except the Saturday preciding Christmas Day, when it shall be 7.00pm

WHOLESALE MARKETS. FRUIT, VEGETABLE and FISH MARKETS

Summer Period

1st May - 30th September

Monday - Tuesday - Thursday - Friday ... .. 6.00am to 3.00pm

Wednesday ... .. 6.00am to 1.00pm

Saturday ... .. 6.00am to 2.00pm

Winter Period

1st October to 30th April

Monday - Tuesday - Thursday - Friday ... .. 7.00am to 3.00pm

Wednesday ... .. 7.00am to 1.00pm

Saturday ... .. 7.00am to 2.00pm

SHEAF MARKET ( Wholesale produce section )

Summer period

Monday and Thursday ... .. 6.00am to 3.00pm

Wednesday ... .. 6.00am to 1.00pm

Tuesday, Friday, Saturday ... .. 6.00am to 10.00am

Winter Period

Monday and Thursday ... .. 7.00am to 3.00pm

Wednesday ... .. 7.00am to 1.00pm

Tuesday, Friday, Saturday ... .. 7.00am to 10.00am

Provided that the market places shall be closed on every Sunday, Good Friday ( except for the sale of fish and perishable goods ) and Christmas Day and on every day appointed for a solemn fast or public Thanksgiving.

4. No person shall sell in any market place any goods at any time other than during market hours.

5. Subject to the provisions of byelaw 6 and paragraph (a ) of byelaw 20, no person shall be admitted or be or remain in or upon any market place except during market hours.

6. No person shall bring any goods into any market place, for purpose of sale, more than one hour before the market opens or allow any goods belonging to him or his charge to remain in any market place other than the Castle Market, more than one hour after the market closes;

Provided that this byelaw shall not apply to tenants (or their employees ) of the lock-up shops within any market place.

#### Extinguishing of Lights

7. Every tenant or occupier of a stall in any market place shall, not later than one hour after the time fixed for the closing of such market place on the day during which the stall may have been used for the sale of goods, extinguish every fire or light in connexion with the stall.

#### Cleaving.

8. No person shall in any market places, cleave any carcase or meat unless it is upon a cleaving block or chopping board, or is properly attached to or suspended from any hooks provided for the purpose.

#### Regulation of Traffic and Obstruction.

9. No person driving any vehical in any road or way in any market place shall proceed at a greater speed tha six miles per hour.

10. No person entering or leaving or driving any cart or other vehicle or animal into or out of any market place shall use any entrance or exit except as Superintendant or Market Officer may from time to time direct.

11. No person in charge of any vehical or beast of burden shall allow it to stand in any avenue or passage in any markey place, or in any of the immidiate approches thereto, for any longer time than is reasonably necessary for the loading and unloading of any goods.
12. No person resorting to any market place and in charge of any vehicle shall station such vehical in any such market as to hinder any other vehicle in arriving at or departing from such market place, or in any loading or unloading any goods at a stall in such market place.
13. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited in any market place (elsewhere than in at or upon a stall ) or in any of the immidiate approaches thereto, any goods or any recepticale for goods for a longer time is reasonably necessary for the loading or unloading of the goods.
14. No person shall bring or convey to , through or from any market place, or cause to stand in any market place, any goods belonging to him or his charge in such a manner as to obstruct free passage through such market places or any of the immidiate approches thereto.
15. No artical shall be placed upon any stall so as to project beyond the front line of such stall.
16. No person shall cause obstruction or annoyance in any market place or it's immidiate approaches

- (a ) by touting or hawking goods for sale,or
- (b) by using the market place for purposes which are not re-lated to the buying selling of goods.

17. No person shall, to the annoyance of any person, wilfully obstruct or hinder any other person in the proper use of any other market place, or of any fittings, or apparatus, provided for use therein.
18. No person shall wilfully throw or drop any waste fruit or vegetable matter or any other market litter, in or upon any avenue or passage in any market place, or upon the staircases in the Castle Market, in a manner likely to cause injury to any person.
19. No person shall wilfully throw or drop any object whatsoever into the apertures provided for the purpose of ventilation and lighting in the upper ground of the Castle Market in a manner likely to cause injury to any person, stall or goods.

#### Cleansing Arrangements

20. Every tenant or occupier of a stall in any market place, shall -
  - (a) immediately before and after market hours and as oftern as may be necessary durring those hours, cause the stall and all appurtenances thereto to be properly cleansed;
  - (b) as oftern as is nessesary, cause all refuse from his trade or bsuness to be placed in a suitable and sufficient recepticale for the purpose;
  - (c) as oftern as is necessary, cause the contents of such receptical to be removed, without creating a nuisance or obstruction, to a place outside such market place, or to such place as shall be appointed by the council, and describe in a legible notice conspicuously displayed at or near such place;
21. Every person conveying goods to or from any market place shall, as oftern as is necessary, and without creating a nuisance or obstruction, remove or cause to be removed from every avenue or passage in such market place, and from the footway or roadway of rhe immediate approches thereto, all refuse arising from the loading or unloading or the conveyance of the goods by him upon or through the avenue, passage, footway or roadway.
22. Every tenant or occupier of a stall in any market place shall cause every avenue or pasage used in

connexion with such stall, whether used by him alone or in conjunction with any other person, to be properly swept and cleansed during each day upon which he uses the stall for the sale of goods, if it is necessary to remove there - frtom any litter or refuse arising from the stall.

#### Crying for Sale

23. No person shall cry any artical whatever for sale in any market place or by ringing a bell or using any instrument seek to attract the custom of any person to any stall or to any artical or thing intended for sale: Provided tha this prohibition so far as it relates to crying stall not apply to the pitching stalls designated by the Council within the Sheaf Market.

#### Plucking of Poultry,etc.

24. No person occupying any stall in the market place shall wash or clean any vegetables after 9.00 o'clock in the morning and no person shall wash any baskets or other thing whatsoever in any market place, exept at the places provided by the council for the purpose, or on the premises occupied by him.

#### Placards,etc.

26. No person other than an officer or servent of the council shall without the permission of the council past or present display any bill or placard other than a description of any goods for sale in or on any pary of any market place.

#### Use of Water Taps.

27. Every person who shall use any water tap in any market place, shall cause the same to be properly turned off immediately after he shall have finished using such tap.

#### Sales by Sample.

28. No person shall in any markey place tout for , or take an order for any marketable commodity not in such market place for which toll would be paid if the same had been for sale in such market place.

#### Dogs.

29. No person occupying any stall in any market shall keep any dog at the same, nor shall any person whatever bring any dog or permit any dog under his control to follow him into any market place: provided that this byelaw shall not be deemed to prevent the bringing of any dog for sale into any part of a market of a blind person's guide dog.

#### Mis-use of Fountains, Water Basins, etc.

30. No person shall throw any stone, brick, shell, cabbage leaf, garbage, offel or any other matter or thing whatsoever exept water into any fountain, water basin or water grate of any market place, or in any manner foul or otherwise improperly use the water supplied to any market place.

#### Occupation of Stalls.

31. Every person bringing goods to market place and wishing to use a stall, shall occupy only the stall to which he is directed by the Superintendant or a Market Officer.

32. The occouper or occupants of any stall on being required to do so by the Superintendant, shall as soon as his, her or their name or names ( including trading name if any ) to be painted or otherwise exhibited in legible letters upon such stall in a position theron approved by th Superintendant and shall maintain such name or names legible and underfased.

#### Penalties.

33. Every person who shall affend against any of the provisions of these byelaws shall on summary conviction be liable to a fine not exeeding the sum of five pounds.

Revocation of Byelaws.

34. The byelaws relating to markets which were made by the council on the sixth day of October, 1954, and on the fourth day of October, 1956, and were confirmed by the Minister of Housing and Local Government on the sixth day of December, 1956, respectively, are hereby revoked.
