Markets Committee 22nd February 1924

A letter from the Sheffield Sheaf Market Association sets out the following resolution passed at their AGM on 22nd January 1924 and noted that the Sheaf Market and Tenants and Stallholders view with grave concern the suggestion to remove the whole of the Sheaf Market into the Fairground and in their opinion such a step would be disastrous to Tenants and Stallholders.

Council Minutes 5th March 1924

The following extract from the minutes was submitted. It was moved that the Councilors appoint a Special Committee to consider and report upon the desirability or otherwise of extending, altering and removing and developing the several markets belonging to the Council. The Committee Decided that the matter should be considered at a special meeting and in the meantime the Town Clerk was required to submit a report on the schemes which have been suggested in connection with the markets in the past.

At the same meeting it was resolved that the Corporate Common Seal to be affixed to an agreement with Messrs Hal Williams and Co in relation to the preparation of plans and the supervision of the construction of the proposed Abattoirs

Council Meeting 14th May 1924

Councillor Humberstone to move that the Markets Committee be instructed to give notice as from 01-08-1924 that they will cease to hold a Market on the public Highway in Castlefolds or in any of adjoining streets, to take rents or tolls from persons for the right to stand on the Public Highway and sell marketable goods and that all the rights and powers of the Corporation on this subject be abandoned from that date.

The city Architect submitted revised plan and estimate for the proposed New Fitzalan Market, Waingate, provision being made for 45 shops (5 being outside the market on castle hill) and 56 stalls, as against 40 shops and 36 stalls in the present Fitzalan Market tennants by the provision of back to back stalls in groups of two, in lieu of the four stall arrangement as previously submitted to the committee. The erection of this market as shown can be carried out immediately without waiting for the construction of the proposed River Don Street.

The entrances to this market will be by Castle Hill, which will be widened to 40 feet allowing for

entrance for all vehicles attending the market, and the other entrances on Exchange Street. The estimated cost of the scheme is £ 40,000.

The committee approved the plan and in accordance with the authority given by the council on 2nd March last, authorized the City Architect to prepare working drawings and obtain tenders for the erection of the market.

Markets Committee 18th February 1927 Re Arrangement of Markets

Present Alderman Marshall (chairman) Councilors J.E. Bennett, Charlesworth, Gascoigne, Unwin, Oates, Skelton, Yorke, Curtis, Hunter and Rowland.

1. We have further considered the question of the re- arrangement of the markets, which has been remitted to us.
2. In our opinion the first requisite is to obtain central of the site of the Fitzalan Market Hall , which is of considerable value and is not being adequately utilized at the present time.
3. We have further considered the question of re - establishing the tenant of that market, and on our instruction the City Architect has prepared a scheme for utilizing a plot of land near Exchange Street , situated at the rear of premises about to be built by the Brightside and Carbrook Co - operative Society on land sold to them by the corporation. Access to this site can be obtained through two arcade entrances leading to Exchange Steet through the Co - operative Societies premises to the site and also through Waingate.
4. The proposed site contains an area of 3.748 square yards and will afford more accommodation

than the present Fitzalan Market Hal.

5. The present building will be a one storey Market Hall, the estimated cost of which will be approximately £ 35. 000.
6. There is land available for extension of the market, which might be utilised either for similar businesses to those now carried on in the Norfolk Market Hall or for transferring other market tenants or for utilization in connection with other Fruit and Vegetable Retail Markets.
7. We recommend the council to give general approval to this proposal, which would not interfere with the re - arrangement of other markets under schemes which have already been submitted to them.
8. If the Council should approve this recommendation, we propose to instruct the City Architect to get out the necessary detailed drawings and specifications, so as to enable us to obtain tenders for the carrying out of the work, which in due course, we hope to submit to the Council.

Meeting 25th February 1927 (special)

The following Resolution passed by the City Council on the 3rd August last, was submitted " That the acts and proceedings of the markets committee since the last meeting of their Minute Book now produced and considered as read, be and are hereby approved of and confirmed, with the exception of so much thereof as relates to the proposal to transfer the sum of £ 772 -17 - 2 , from the surplus on the market accounts to relief of city rates, as shewn on page 2 of the statement of accounts for the year ending 31st 1927, and that such sum be transferred to the markets reserve fund, as transferred to the markets finance committee".

RESOLVED: " That the items entered in the Requisition Book, now submitted amounting to £ 400-15- 5 , be approved Mr J. E Bennett - Mr Unwin.

The city architect submitted revised plan an estimated for the proposed new Fitzalan Market, Waingate, provision being made for 45 shops (5 being outside the market on Castle Hill) and 56 stalls , as against 40 shops and 36 stalls in the present Fitzalan Market. The scheme has been re-designed to meet, as far as possible, the requirements of the Fitzalan Market tenants by the provision of back to back stalls in groups of two, in lieu of the four stall arrangement as previously submitted to the committee. The erection of this Market as shown can be carried out immediately without waiting for the construction of the proposed River Don Street.

The entrances to this market will be by Castle Hill , which will be widened to 40 feet allowing for entrance for all vehicles attending the market, and the other entrances will be through th arcades on to Exchange Street.

The estimated cost of the scheme is £40-000.

The committee approved the plan and in accordance with the authority given by the council on the 2nd March 1929, authorized the City Architect to prepare working drawings and obtain tenders for the erection of the market.

Markets Committee 20th Dec 1929

Norfolk Market: Authority given for the erection of screens at each of the 2 entrances at the East end of the market (In accordance with the scheme for the improvement of the Market) at estimated cost of £300.

Meeting of the clothing sub-committee 11th April 1930

Present-Councillors, J Cobley and Furniss The sub-committee recommend that the tender of Messrs R S Whitworth Ltd to supply certain uniform clothing for Markets and Abattoir employees in accordance with sample now chosen for the sum of £103/7/0 be accepted and that the corporate seal be affixed to the contract.

Markets Committee 16th May 1930

Authority given for 3 shops abutting on Castle Hill provided for in the Castle Hill Market scheme at a cost of £2250

Markets Committee 20th June 1930

The Superintendent of the Markets was authorized to sign agreement with Messrs Avery Ltd in respect of maintenance of weighing machines at Abattoir involving the sum of £44 per year.

Markets Committee 20th June 1930

Resolved Mr I B Coulton manager of Corporation Abattoir be appointed Superintendent of the markets and Abattoir from 1st July 1930 at a salary of £700 per annum plus the Manager's house at Abattoir with gas, coal, electricity and water.

Markets Committee 15th August 1930

Committee authorized the transfer offices of the Superintendent of the Markets and Abattoir and his staff from Norfolk Market Hall to Castle hill market and expenditure of about £80 in provision of shelves, linoleum etc.

Markets Committee 6th January 1932

Total cost for the Castle Hill Market of £50,869/18/7 mentioned in Architects report is the final cost of the work and is approved.

Council Meeting 3rd February 1932

Didn't agree on times of closing extension of Castlefolds market stands – had to go back to it

Markets Committee 15th January 1932

Discussion about times of closing at extension of Castlefolds Market stands not resolved

Markets Committee 1948

Superintendent of Market authorized to use private cars for official business from 21.12.49 and that

he be designated an essential user.

Markets Committee 1949

The committee agreed that the closing hours of all Markets should be 6.00pm on Christmas Eve and that the Markets be closed on Boxing Day and on Bank Holiday the next day.

Markets Committee 19th August 1949

Proposals for extension of Castle Hill Market on property in Waingate and Exchange St and erection of a new building as part of that new extension inc. licensed premises, restaurant, offices and lock up shops.

Jubilee celebrations 1899-1949 Sub Committee recommend the celebrations to commemorate the Jubilee of the Markets undertaking be held during the week Mon 26th September to Sat 1st Oct 1949 inclusive.

Markets committee 21st October 1955

'Exchange Street Site – Proposed Retail Markets' resolved – had paid £92, 500 to Brightside and Carbrook Co-Operative Society and further sum of £12, 400 in respect of existing site foundations

Markets Committee 17th February 1956

New Retail Market.

The committee approved the draft brochure which it is intended to supply at small charge to applicants for tenancies of the shops, kiosks and office accommodation to be provided in the New Retail Market Exchange street and gave authority for an order to be placed with the printing and stationery department for the supply of 500 copies of the brochure at an estimated cost of £250.

Name of the market. The committee decided that the Retail Market in Exchange Street, incorporating the existing Castle Hill Market and the New Market now under construction, be named " Castle Market".

Lease.

RESOLVED; " That the Corporate Common Seal be affixed to a lease to the Yorkshire Electricity Board of certain accomodation in the basement of the New Retail Market in Exchange Street, for the purposes of an electricity substation, upon the terms and conditions now reported." -Mr Marsden- Mr Curtis.

Lettings of Shops and Offices.

The committee gave authority for a General Superintendant to advertise, at an estimated cost of £250, the shops and offices accommodation to be made available in the New Retail Market and decided that a charge of 2/6 be made for the descriptive booklet which it is intended to supply to prospective tenants.

Refuse Vehicles.

RESOLVED; " That an order be placed with Shefflex Ltd, of Sheffield for the supply of the undermentioned vehicals to the specifications now reported and at the prices stated, which are

required for the purpose of the New Retail Market Exchange Street, and for general use in the markets; That the Corporate Common Seal be affixed to any necessary contract, and that the provision of standing order No 52 (b) be excepted in this case.

Closing of the Markets - Christmas 1958,

The committee decided that the Castle Hill, Norfolk and Sheaf Retail Market, the Castle Foulds Wholesale fruit and Vegetable Market and the Wholesale fish Market be closed on Christmas Day the 25th December, and Boxing Day the 26th December 1958. The committee also approved the following arrangements to operate at the Public Abattoir during the Christmas period.

Wednesday 24th December 1958 open 7.45am to 10.00 am

Boxing Day CLOSED

Wednesday 24th December 1958 open 8.00am to 12 noon.

(note) - Pursuant to the Bylaws with respect to Markets the Castle Hill, Norfolk and Sheaf Retail Markets will remain open until 6pm on the Thursday the 18th, Friday the 19th, Monday the 22nd, Tuesday the 23rd and Xmas Eve the 24th December and until 7pm on the Saturday the 20th December 1958.

Market Committee 3rd February 1959 (special)

(submitted to and adopted by the City Council 4th February 1959)

Closing of Norfolk Market Hall.

RESOLVED; " (1) That pursuant to section 222 of the Sheffield Corporation (Consolidation) Act 1918 the Norfolk Market Hall be wholly discontinued and closed for Market purposes on the 30th June 1959 or on such later date as the portion of the new Sheffield Castle Market now under construction shall have been established and provided for public use and that upon such discontinuance and closure the market now carried on in the said Norfolk Market Hall shall be removed to the said new portion of the Sheffield Castle Market and be established therein;

(2) That the Town Clerk be authorised to give and affix the notices required by sub-section (1) of section 223 of the said Act of the Corporation's intention so to discontinue and close the said Norfolk Market Hall; (3) That on such closure as aforesaid the rights of all the then existing lessees and tenants of the said Norfolk Market Hall shall cease and determine; and (4) That the Town Clerk be authorised to take all other necessary steps in connection with the matter and that the Corporate Common Seal be affixed to any necessary documents." - Mr Marsden - Mr J Dyson.

Market Rents- Sheffield Castle Market.

The General Superintendent submitted a report as to the maximum rents and sums to be fixed in respect of the New Retail Sheffield Castle Market and the rents and sums which he considers should for the time being be applied within such maxima.

The Town Clerk reported on the procedure which would be involved to give effect to such proposals and explained that the Minister of Housing and Local Government had been consulted on

the matter and he had indicated that, subject to the consideration of any objections he might receive, he would be prepared to approve such maximum of rents and sums.

The committee approved the proposals and it was-
RESOLVED; " (a) That the city council be recommended to pass a resolution in the following terms, namely " That the pursuant to the provision of sub-section (1) of section 234 of the Sheffield Corporation (Consolidation) Act, 1918, the City Council of Sheffield do hereby fix the following rents and sums as the maximum rents and sums recoverable by the Lord Mayor, Alderman and citizens of the City of Sheffield in respect of their market undertaking in addition to these Market rents, tolls, stallages; etc., specified in the said Act:-

Provided that the above rents and sums shall be recoverable only in respect of those portions of the Sheffield Castle Market which are coloured in purple and pink respectively on the plan of the said market sealed with the Common Seal of the Council and marked "Plan referred to in the list of market rents, etc. fixed by resolution of the City Council on the fourth day of February 1959, and deposited at the Town Hall Sheffield 1.

(b) That the Corporate Common Seal be affixed to such resolution and plan and that the Town Clerk be authorised to take the necessary steps to secure the approval of such resolution by the Minister of Housing and Local Government; and (c) That subject to such approval being secured the undermentioned rents and sums be applied until such time as they may be varied by the council:-.

Markets Committee 15th July 1970

Threat of withdrawal of labour. The General Manager reported on a threat of withdrawal of Labour to take place from 10th July which had been made by the Sweeper/Handymen at the Retail Markets arising from a dispute over recent pay awards to Market and abattoir workers.

Lease of Premises at Castle Hill Market Building to the RAF.
